Please remain standing

A Seasonal Invitation to Confession or the following is read.

God so loved the world
that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ
to save us from our sins,
to be our advocate in heaven,
and to bring us to eternal life.

Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith,
firmly resolved to keep God's commandments
and to live in love and peace with all.

**Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against thee
and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.**

**We are truly sorry
and repent of all our sins.**

**For the sake of thy Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us,
forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve thee in newness of life
to the glory of thy name.**

Amen.

OR

Most merciful God,
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought, word and deed.
We have not loved thee with our whole heart.
We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.
In thy mercy forgive what we have been,
help us to amend what we are,
and direct what we shall be;
that we may do justly,
love mercy, and walk humbly with thee, our God.
Amen.

Absolution

Almighty God,
who forgives all who truly repent,
+ have mercy upon you,
pardon and deliver you from all your sins,
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,
and keep you in life eternal;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

Please sit

Glory be to God on high, and in earth peace, goodwill towards men.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we glorify thee,
we give thanks to thee for thy great glory,

O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father almighty.

O Lord, the only-begotten Son Jesu Christ;

O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,

that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.

Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer.

Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us.

For thou only art holy; thou only art the Lord; thou only, O Christ,
with the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Gospel Procession

The choir sings with Gospel Acclamation

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to....

Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At the end of the Gospel reading

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to thee, O Christ.

Please sit after the opening prayer

The Creed

Please stand

Let us declare our faith in God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

**I believe in one God the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth, and of all things
visible and invisible:**

**And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God,
begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of
Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one
substance with the Father, by whom all things were made;
who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven,
and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was
made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.
He suffered and was buried, and the third day he rose again
according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven,
and sitteth on the right hand of the Father.**

**And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and
the dead: whose kingdom shall have no end.**

**And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father
and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spake by
the prophets.**

**And I believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins.
And I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the
world to come. Amen.**

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented.

The altar is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it.

Offertory Prayer

God of all goodness and grace,
receive the gifts we offer;
and grant that our whole life
may give you glory and praise;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

One or more prayers at the preparation of the table are said.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Sursum Corda

The Lord be with you and with thy spi-rit.
or The Lord is here. His Spi-rit is with us.
Lift up your hearts. We lift them up un-to the Lord.
Let us give thanks un - to the Lord our God.
It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right and our bounden duty, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God, through Jesus Christ thine only Son our Lord.

For he is thy living Word; through him thou hast created all things from the beginning, and fashioned us in thine own image.

Through him thou didst redeem us from the slavery of sin, giving him to be born of a woman, to die upon the cross, and to rise again for us.

Through him thou hast made us a people for thine own possession, exalting him to thy right hand on high, and sending forth through him thy holy and life-giving Spirit.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious name, evermore praising thee and singing:

The Choir sings the Sanctus and Benedictus:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of hosts,
heaven and earth are full of thy glory.
Glory be to thee, O Lord, most high.
Blessed is he who cometh in the name of the Lord,
Hosanna in the highest.

*Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus, Dominus Deus Saboath
pleni sunt coeli et terra Gloria tua hosanna in excelsis
Benedictus qui venit in nomine Domini. Hosanna in excelsis.*

We sit or kneel

Accept our praises, heavenly Father,
through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ,
and as we follow his example and obey his command,
grant that by the power of thy Holy Spirit
these gifts of bread and wine may be to us
his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and when he had given thanks to thee,
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise, after supper
he took the cup and when he had given thanks to thee,
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink ye all of this;
for this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we remember his offering of
himself made once for all upon the cross;
we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;
we look for the coming of his kingdom, and with this bread and this cup
we make the memorial of Christ thy Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Accept through him, our great high priest,
this our sacrifice of thanks and praise,
and as we eat and drink these holy gifts
in the presence of thy divine majesty,
renew us by thy Spirit, inspire us with thy love,
and unite us in the body of thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty, world without end.

Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence, as our Saviour has taught us

Our Father,
who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.

The Breaking of Bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.

The Invitation

One of the following three options is used.

Draw near with faith.

Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ
which he gave for you,
and his blood that he shed for you.

Eat and drink
in remembrance that he died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts
by faith with thanksgiving.

OR

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest
come under my roof,
but speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.**

OR

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.
**Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

*Whilst those helping with the administration receive, the choir
sings the Agnus Dei:*

O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world,
have mercy upon us.
